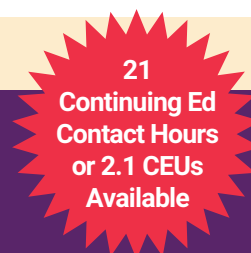

Featured Presenters



Dr. Edward "Ned" Hallowell is a child and adult psychiatrist, as well as founder of the Hallowell Centers with offices in Sudbury (MA), New York, San Francisco and Seattle. A specialist in learning differences, his 1994 groundbreaking *New York Times* bestseller *Driven to Distraction* brought attention deficit disorder to the general public. He has gone on to write 19 more books on various psychological topics including *Shine, Delivered from Distraction*, *Dare to Forgive* and *The Childhood Roots of Adult Happiness*. Dr. Hallowell's major contribution to the field of learning is his strength-based approach. Having both ADHD and dyslexia himself, and having thrived with those conditions throughout his life, he sees them not as disorders but rather as traits that can confer enormous benefit. If these traits are managed well, they can turbo-charge success. But if they are managed poorly or not recognized at all, they can lead to disaster. For this reason, Ned is committed to getting the message out to recognize and capitalize on these traits.



Kaye Randall is a nationally known author and speaker who has led professional seminars throughout North America on student mental health, bullying, self-injury, depression, anxiety and anger – as well as youth leadership and student empowerment. Kaye has inspired seminar participants through her practical insights, humor, and proactive strategies for helping children and adolescents. She continues to provide clinical services to both children and adolescents and has been named social worker of the year by the Council on Adoptable Children. She is co-author of *See My Pain: Creative Strategies & Activities for Helping Young People Who Self-Injure* (featured in *USA Today*), *102 Creative Strategies for Working with Depressed Children & Adolescents*, and *Mean Girls: 101½ Creative Strategies and Activities for Working with Relational Aggression*.



Paul Tough is the author, most recently, of *Helping Children Succeed: What Works and Why*. His previous book, *How Children Succeed: Grit, Curiosity, and the Hidden Power of Character*, was translated into 27 languages and spent more than a year on *The New York Times* hardcover and paperback best-seller lists. His first book, *Whatever It Takes: Geoffrey Canada's Quest to Change Harlem and America*, was published in 2008. Paul is a contributing writer to *The New York Times Magazine*, where he has written extensively about education, parenting, poverty and politics. His writing has also appeared in *The New Yorker*, *The Atlantic*, *GQ*, and *Esquire*, and on the op-ed page of the *The New York Times*. He has also worked as a reporter and producer for the public-radio program *This American Life*.



Mike Paget, M.Ed. works as a consultant to schools throughout North America to help them better teach challenging students. He is an innovator of effective approaches for working with students who are "wired differently" and has conducted keynote presentations and seminars across the U.S. and Canada on creative techniques for crisis intervention and managing classroom behavior. As a state education department consultant for students with severe emotional and behavioral problems, Mike spent 20 years working extensively with ODD, CD and other special needs. His books include *Defying the Defiance: 131 Insights, Strategies, Lessons and Activities for Helping Students with ODD and Aggressive and Violent Students*. His newest book is *High on the Spectrum: Asperger's, High-Functioning Autism & Related Personalities*.



Dr. Yong Zhao currently serves as a Foundations Distinguished Professor at the University of Kansas and was previously the Presidential Chair and Director of the Institute for Global and Online Education in the College of Education, University of Oregon, where he was also a Professor in the Department of Educational Measurement, Policy and Leadership. His works focus on the implications of globalization and technology on education. He has published more than 100 articles and 20 books, including *Who's Afraid of the Big Bad Dragon: Why China has the Best (and Worst) Education System in the World*, *Catching Up or Leading the Way: American Education in the Age of Globalization* and *World Class Learners: Educating Creative and Entrepreneurial Students*. He was named one of the 10 Most Influential People in Educational Technology by the *Tech & Learn Magazine*. His latest book *World Class Learners* has won several awards including the Society of Professors of Education Book Award, Association of Education Publishers' (AEP) Judges' Award and Distinguished Achievement Award in Education Leadership.



Brian Mendler is a dynamic speaker who trains thousands of educators a year through his affiliation with Teacher Learning Center, focusing on how to be successful with even the most difficult students. Brian is a certified K-12 and special education teacher with extensive experience working with challenging students in general ed, self-contained and inclusion settings. He often draws upon his own experience as a very disruptive student with severe, undiagnosed ADHD and reading difficulties. Brian is the author or co-author of *That One Kid*, *The Taming of the Crew*, *Power Struggles 2nd Edition* and the bestseller *Discipline with Dignity 3rd Edition*.

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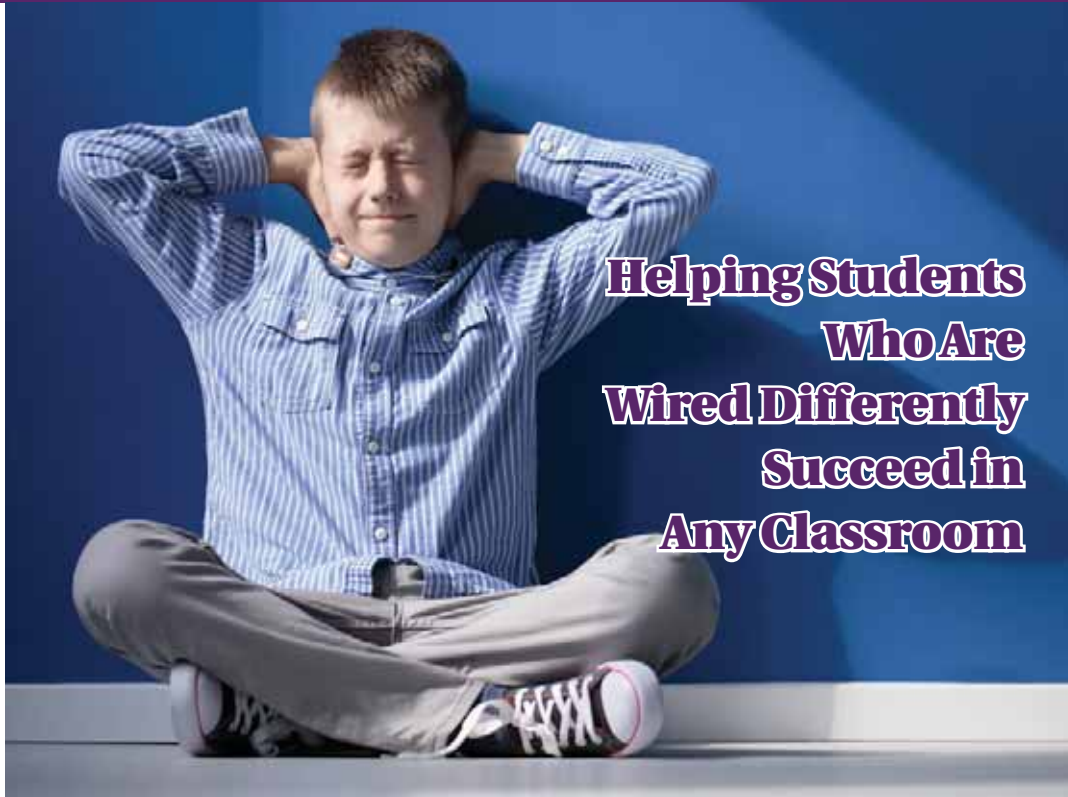
